

5-Section Challenge 2016

The Rogue Carver's Guild invites all interested individuals to participate in a "5-Section Challenge. To complete this challenge, participants must enter a minimum of five carvings in the IAIW Show in 2016. Participants must enter one carving in each of the five carving sections of the IWG prospectus. The prospectus can be found at the Idaho Artistry in Wood website, "www.idahoartistryinwood.org". Each entrant will receive a participation award.

Details:

- -You must enter one piece into each of the sections as defined in the IWG 2016 show prospectus.
- -You may enter as many pieces in each section as allowed by the IWG 2016 show prospectus.
- -Points are awarded for each ribbon won in the show competition. 1st place =4 Pts, 2nd place=3Pts, 3rd place=2Pts and HM=1pt.
- -Those who enter a piece in all 5 sections will receive a participation patch.
- -Participant that accrues the highest point total will receive the grand prize. The photo shows the prize for 2014.
