Minutes of April 12 IWG Meeting

The monthly meeting of the Idaho Woodcarvers Guild began at 6 p.m. with a guided project on carving hands led by Larry Crist with assistance from Eric Owens following introduction of guests and newcomers. Work on the carving project continued while Eric introduced the evening's door prize event at 7:40 p.m. Nine winners took home tools, books and other items. Beck Beus led the show and tell time featuring two of his bark carved houses and a coke bottle Santa by Don Brigham.

Carving of the hands continued during the remaining business portion of the meeting, which included:

- 1. A treasurer's report submitted by Jim Jameson showing that the club continues to have a healthy bank balance after show expenses and wood purchases for club projects.
- 2. A report on the Idaho Artistry in Wood Show which noted strong publicity, record attendance and wide participation. Don Brigham, supported by Eric Owens recommended to the board an incentive plan including possible monetary awards for participants in next year's show who placed entries in at least four divisions. The recommendation was received with positive support for further discussion and development by the board. Larry noted that the carvers are in charge of the 2019 show and recommended that the club volunteer to take charge of specific aspects of the show, including production of hang tags and handbills, the banquet and the silent and banquet auctions. There was a positive response to the proposal, which will allow the club representatives on the IAW Show Committee to offer to take on those responsibilities.

- 3. A discussion on how best to meet the wood needs for club projects. The Oregon supplier we have relied on over the past year is going out of business. A motion was passed to give Larry Crist authority to purchase up to \$300 worth of his top quality wood to see us through this year, with a plan to look at purchasing wood from a Utah vendor at next year's IAW show.
- 4. Announcement of multiple coming events where we have been invited to set up displays and provide demonstrations. These include:
- April 28 9:30 a.m. 4 p.m. MK Nature Center Spring Wildlife Event. Confirmed participants: Eric and Thekla Owens, Don Brigham, Doug Rose. Jane Eubanks and Dean Shaw will advise if they will be able to participate.
- June 9, 10 World Village Festival in front of the Capitol. 10 a.m.
- 7 p.m. Norm Sullivan and Doug Rose available.
- August 17-25 Western Idaho Fair. Sign up sheet will be available at future club meetings.
- October Hidden Springs Fair invitation. Decision will be made later on whether to participate.
- 5. Elections for board positions will be held at the May 10 club meeting. Nominations have been made for the positions of president and treasurer and two of the trustees will continue. Nominations are needed for the positions of vice president and secretary and one trustee.
