
Carving Tips


Coban Wrap – Save those Coban adhesive wraps from your blood draws. They have lots of uses in the shop. A couple of them are illustrated below. You can make a thumb guard or reinforce your worn carving glove with it or use it to wrap delicate edges on carvings while working on them to prevent damage.



Painting aid – When painting copper wire habitat elements such as leaf stems or pine needles, insert them into a cellulose sponge to dry so they do not touch anything while drying.
